- A continuum of supports identifies strategies and accommodation to best support student along a continuums. As we know not all student learn the same and some students may require more support to be successful. At EGW we have a variety of continuum of supports.
 - Our first continuum is for relationships.  - Our second continuum is social/emotional. This continuum helps us support students in their social/emotional development and put strategies and supports in place to tach students the skills needed to mange their own needs as well as meet the needs of others.
 - Our third continuum is a continuum of behaviour within this continuum is our Code of Conduct where we utilize progressive discipline and restorative practices to support
